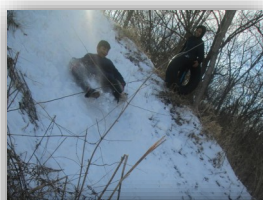
High School Winter Retreat

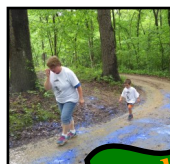

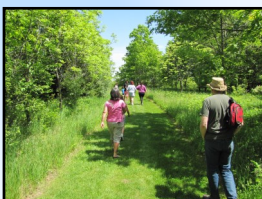

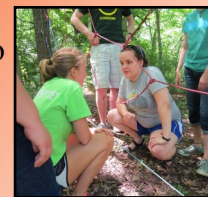
Facilitator Workshop

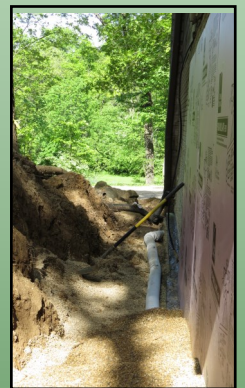
Renovation & Bringing New Life to Oak Lodge



Renovation is defined by Wikipedia as "the process of improving a broken, damaged or outdated structure. Additionally, renovation can refer to making something new or bringing something back to life." It is our prayer this happens for all who come to Menno Haven – that broken hearts and tired spirits can be brought back to life in Christ Jesus!



Renovation is also needed for outdated, worn physical buildings that have served countless people for almost 40 years. **Starting October 10** of this year, the Oak Lodge Bunkrooms will be gutted and resurrected as Dorm Rooms in time for Winter Retreats in January 2017! Paul Yoder, former Facilities Director and Project Manager of the Hickory Dorm Room Renovation, will be returning as the Project Manager for the Oak Lodge Renovation. His knowledge of the prior renovation will be a great asset for this project. In preparation for a speedy renovation, windows have already been cut in and installed, new drain tile dug in around the building and the old drop ceiling has been removed and sheet rock has been temporarily installed.



In the coming months, we will be looking for skilled workers – framers, concrete workers, plumbers, electricians, dry-wallers, finish carpenters – who are willing to lend an expert hand during October -January. There are also times when we will need strong arms and willing workers to move furniture, do demolition, bust out concrete floors, etc. We also need faithful prayer warriors. We are looking to have people sign up to pray each day of the project – for safety, for volunteers to come forth, for equipment to be available as needed and not breakdown, for the tasks to go smoothly without obstacles, for provision of funds to complete this project, etc. Please contact our office if you are interested in helping in any of these positions for this renovation and our volunteer coordinator will contact you with scheduling information. Help bring life back into these buildings so they can better serve Menno Haven's mission to invite all to experience God's World and Christ's Kingdom.
