This week of camp for them is a true break from the regular year. The campers all have friends here from previous years and making the most of their time together and making memories is very important to many of them. This year I was not as worried about how to get to activities on time but instead focus more on building relationships in and around camp, especially with the boys in my cabin.

I found there were three things that stood out most about this summer. The first would be the increase of just listening to camper's stories and past experiences and many would ask about my past and how I dealt with things or my opinion about different topics. This was a way to mentor and share how I've matured and the way I went about making decisions. The second would be compassion. Compassion in just knowing that by being with these kids you could potentially have an effect on them that could last a lifetime and the memories they make this one week can affect their whole world and how they could treat others. The third would be direction. Many of these kids had started their walk with Christ but just didn't know what they should do next. Many of the bible lessons had tasks for the day and items to think about, and these small reminders every day showed these kids that there are little tasks we as individuals can do to show the love of Jesus through our actions and the way we treat others.

This summer was a beneficial experience. I know I learned a lot about myself and grew in many ways. The knowledge from the year before helped me focus on new aspects of interactions with campers. I am very blessed by the decision of Menno Haven to have me back for another summer this year.

youth groups, men's groups, women's groups, church groups, and youth camps. Were you one of these individuals?






Currently 87%, or \$166,000, has been raised towards the \$190,000 goal for the Oak Lodge Renovation. We would
