June & July In Review
















Family Camps & Haven At Home Boxes 2020

Back in February when we chose **the theme "Build This House" for this summer**, we had no idea the curveball God would be sending us. Our theme verse was from **Ephesians 2:22**, "And because you belong to him, you too are being built together. You are being made into a house where God lives through his Spirit." We also planned to spend each day marinating in a different chapter of Daniel as **we looked at what is needed to build and develop our earthly houses and our spiritual houses** - our Foundation: Jesus (Daniel 1), Walls: Bible Study (Daniel 9), Roof: Prayer (Daniel 6), Furnishings: Friendships (Daniel 2), and Upkeep: Godly Living (Daniel 3). We planned for a normal summer, and then everything changed. We kept this study structure for the videos in the Haven at Home Boxes and for our worship and campfire sessions during Family Camps. Being quarantined in our homes brought this theme into an entirely new light. It reminded us how important our houses actually are and how much we rely on them.

In June the Haven at Home Boxes were delivered to the campers. We have loved every story and testimony that you sent us connected with these boxes and are glad we were able to serve you in this way while we couldn't gather together. Here is what a couple friends had to say about it. "This is the first year in several [my son] hasn't gone to camp and [my youngest son] was really looking forward to attending camp this year. This is the next best thing. [My youngest] bugged me about it all day." "Thank you Menno Haven. This Haven at Home week has been so much fun!" After we heard that we could start hosting family units again, we jumped on revamping our Family Camp to meet CDC and IDPH guidelines to safely invite families here to camp. We had 11 families participate throughout July. Social distancing at camp is easier to do in the great wide open and we loved hearing the feedback from parents and kids. The laughs and the adventures shared helped us know we were helping serve a purpose during these hazy crazy days of summer. The cost is \$15 for a family of 5 with \$3/person thereafter per session.


