I don't know if you have been to Menno Haven in the last 6 months or so, but if you haven't, you are in for a treat when you return. As you drive in the Menno Haven lane you will have to thank some generous donors who had the desire, vision, and resources to chip and tar the gravel driveway. This process started several years ago when thicker layers of gravel were put down to prepare a base layer on the driveway. Last summer repairs were done to help improve water flow and drainage along the lanes. Then this past September three layers of chip and tar were put down to create a solid and uniform surface on the driveways and parking lots at the Lakeview Lodge, the Eagle Wing Activity Center, the Pavilion and staff homes. This is a significant upgrade for all who visit Menno Haven. Thank you to the visionaries, workers, and donors who made this possible!



For the past year or two we have been working on some **needed internet infrastructure**



upgrades here at Menno Haven. Progress was slower than we would have liked but it was significantly limited by our lovely countryside setting that is 10+ miles from larger towns. **But God started moving in incredible ways**. This past summer fiber optic lines were being installed down 910 North Ave, the road that goes past Eagle Wing Activity Center (EWAC). Doc talked with the in-

stallers and they agreed to put a handhole by the lane to EWAC. They even drilled the line under the road so if and when we would be able to run fiber on camp, and gain service, we would be ready. What a gift! This started the ball rolling. We have some constituents who tirelessly looked for deals to purchase the fiber optic cable and the underground conduit to run the fiber in. During that process we were connected with a company who not only donated the conduit, they donated the labor to install the conduit and run the fiber throughout the Menno Haven campus as well. Wow! We were blessed with warm weather at the beginning of January to complete that task. Then mid-February some other friends came and spliced all the fiber together! **The end result is a reliable fast internet that we could barely dream of 2 years ago.** This is a significant impact as much of the our office work as well as our phone systems and food ordering rely on reliable good internet service. Reliable faster internet will also provide guest groups with the ability to connect with those who cannot physically be here. Thank you Lord for your provision!

Thank you thank you to all who gave towards the Year End Appeal in December. You are making it

possible for the ministry and vision of Menno Haven to be carried out. Additionally, with your help we are closer to having the 2023 Summer Cabin Improvements and the Patio Renovation fully funded. Thank you for being the hands and feet of Jesus, providing love, care, and hope to all who come to this place.
